

After the success of our initial Unbound performances last October, Thistle is thrilled to be returning to the Jefferson Market Library. This year, after discussing a few different options with our partners, we have set forth on an exploration of the Seven Deadly Sins.

Wading through lore and popular notions, this production gave us the opportunity to play with the sins in their varied faces and attitudes. Often alluded to in biblical settings or painted with sulfuric glaze in the pages of Dante, the sins can appear overly simplistic. Their base and intrinsic presence within us, however, should not be confused for lack of intricacy. These characteristics The Art of Sin views as characters.

So the new line of questions blooms: What tilts their singular focus from passion to obsession? Looking at the sins in context of the set of them and the roles they play in our lives makes one wonder...What are the sins like unfiltered, unfettered, and unjudged? Could there be softness? Could there be relationships that were actually restorative instead of toxic? Is sin just a twisting and tangling of impulse?

Thistle is proud to bring our lot of seven sins and their hosts to the library in their own skin, unapologetically themselves.

We use movement as our primary language, conjuring wonderfully strange creations that challenge our codified perception of history and lore.




Em King (The Artist)



ABOUT OUR HOSTS

JEFFERSON MARKET PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Jefferson Market Library has served the Greenwich Village community for over forty years. The building, now a New York City landmark, was designed by architects Frederick Clark Withers and Calvert Vaux (who also assisted in the design of Central Park) in a Victorian Gothic style to be a courthouse. It was erected between 1875 and 1877.

What the city got for its money, in addition to an architectural gem (voted one of the ten most beautiful buildings in America by a poll of architects in the 1880s) was a civil court on the second floor, now the Adult Reading Room, and a police court, now the first-floor Children's Room. The beautiful brick-arched basement, now the Reference Room, was used as a holding area for prisoners on their way to jail or trial. Scattered about the building were offices and chambers, and looming a hundred feet above ground was the firewatcher's tower. The tower, still intact, commands an uninterrupted view of Greenwich Village, and houses the bell that would summon volunteer firemen.

In 1959, the city planned to knock it down, but Village community members, led by Margot Gayle and Philip Wittenberg, and including Lewis Mumford, E.E. Cummings (who lived across the street in Patchin Place) and actor Maurice Evans, rallied to save the building from the wrecking ball. In 1961, Mayor Robert F. Wagner announced that it would be preserved and converted into a public library. The task of converting the old courthouse to a modern library was undertaken by architect Giorgio Cavaglieri, who also adapted the Astor Library into the Public Theatre on Lafayette Street.

Since its re-opening in 1967, The Jefferson Market Regional Library has been collecting books on the history of New York City—and particularly, Greenwich Village. It has been and continues to be a beacon of community, often partnering with local artists to host their work or celebrate special events. Thistle Dance now has the pleasure of joining that tradition.
